

Impact on Students



Departmental Services: CEOP provides assistance to students and community members in very different capacities. Our outreach component serves individuals in our community that range from kindergarten to those individuals who dropped out of high school and want to complete their GED and eventually enroll in postsecondary education, a career position or the military. Our higher education initiatives serve those students who are prospective UNM students, those who have already been admitted to UNM, or those who need additional assistance to succeed at UNM. The target population of CEOP programs is serving students who are first generation and/or low income and are from traditionally underrepresented populations; however, all students are welcomed as we have an open-door policy.

Departmental Programming: CEOP has collaborated with nearly every department in Student Affairs. We have strong partnerships with Recreational Services, Career Services, Dean of Students, Graduate Resource Center, ENLACE and the Mentoring Institute. We also have strong partnerships with Academic Affairs through University College, the College of Arts & Sciences, and the Provost's Office.

Student Support: CEOP consists of 10 different programs which each hire anywhere from 4 to 30 students in any given year. Not only do the programs hire undergraduate students, but also hire graduate students. Students are trained every year and are also encouraged to participate in different activities available to them throughout the university. The department has also assisted students financially to attend professional development opportunities throughout the university and out of the state.
