Who We Are

The College Prep Programs serve students of all ages from all communities within New Mexico. CPP strives to give students a foundation of college and career readiness skills, leadership and team work skills and the college life experience. Through campus visits, residential programs, and community outreach the College Prep Programs is able to reach New Mexico students and give them information, skills and experiences that make college a reality.

Mission

The mission of College Prep Programs (CPP) is to promote P-20 student success and post-secondary education, from college awareness to college readiness, through academics, career exploration, civic engagement, college-life and leadership development for students from low-income and first generation college-attending families in New Mexico and across the country. The College Readiness Program provides year-long support and college and career readiness classes, philanthropy projects, cultural events and dual-credit. The Summer College Prep Programs provides various residential camps focusing on allowing students to experience college life through academic courses, career exploration, leadership training, college life workshops, and cultural excursions.

Vision

The vision of the College Prep Programs is to make college a reality and give students the foundational skills and knowledge to successfully navigate the post-secondary institution.

Impact on Students

The College Prep Programs has been able to reach 800+ students each year through various avenues. Outreach efforts bring hundreds of students to visit the UNM campus. Students are able to work directly with college students and support program staff to learn more about the opportunities available to them and the experience of students on campus. The CPP Residential programs allow students to experience the college campus life first hand, make connections with student support staff, and gather more information on programs available at the university, and network with career professionals. CPP students enrolled in the College Readiness Program are able to gain college credit and support as they learn more about college and career readiness. These students develop their leadership skills, research career opportunities and participate in philanthropy projects as they prepare for graduation. Students in the College Readiness program have a 100% high school graduation rate and 85% attend some kind of post-secondary institution. Each student interaction presses the idea that college is a real possibility regardless of the background the students come from.

Each campus visit is tailored to fit the group visiting. <p><u>College Readiness – Fall Semester (Dual Credit)</u> – Students in the College Readiness Fall course attend a 2 hour class each week. <p><u>College Readiness (Summer Residential Programming)</u> – Students spend three-days, two-nights on campus learning more about college life and what the University of New Mexico has to offer. Students engage with the different colleges and programs on campus and learn more about the student support.</p> <p>Target Population – High School Seniors, 1st generation, low income, minority students in Albuquerque & surrounding communities.</p> <p>Students Served – 25</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Professionalism • Communication • Critical Thinking
<p><u>Summer Law Camp (Summer Residential Programming)</u> – Students stay on campus for six-days, 5-nights and attend educational field trips to the different courthouses in Albuquerque, college readiness preparation workshops, leadership activities, team building exercises, and law preparation curriculum presented by a practicing local attorneys. The program concludes with a mock trial presented at the District Courthouse in Albuquerque, New Mexico in front of an official courthouse judge and a jury made up of professional lawyers.</p> <p>Target Population – Middle School, 1st generation, low income, minority students in New Mexico.</p> <p>Students Served - 24</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Professionalism • Communication • Critical Thinking
<p><u>Google STEM (Spring Workshops & Summer Residential Programming)</u> – Students attended spring workshops monthly and learned how to choose a research topic; develop a research question and how to research using credible sources. The students then attended a 5 day, 4 night program where they learned how to present their research, attended STEM based tours and learned more about STEM opportunities at UNM.</p> <p>Target Population – High School, 1st generation, low income, minority students in the Moriarty school district.</p> <p>Students Served – 9</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research & Assessment • Critical Thinking • Collaboration

Goals for 2017-18

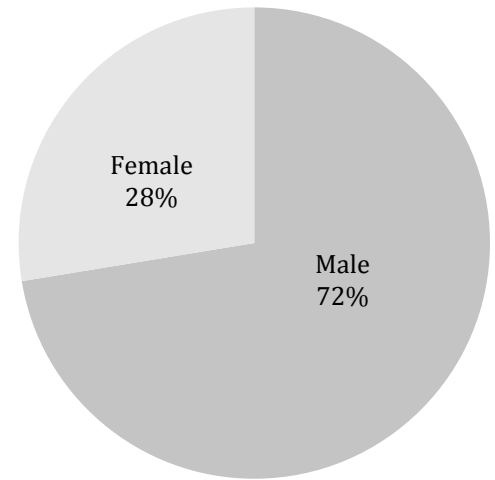
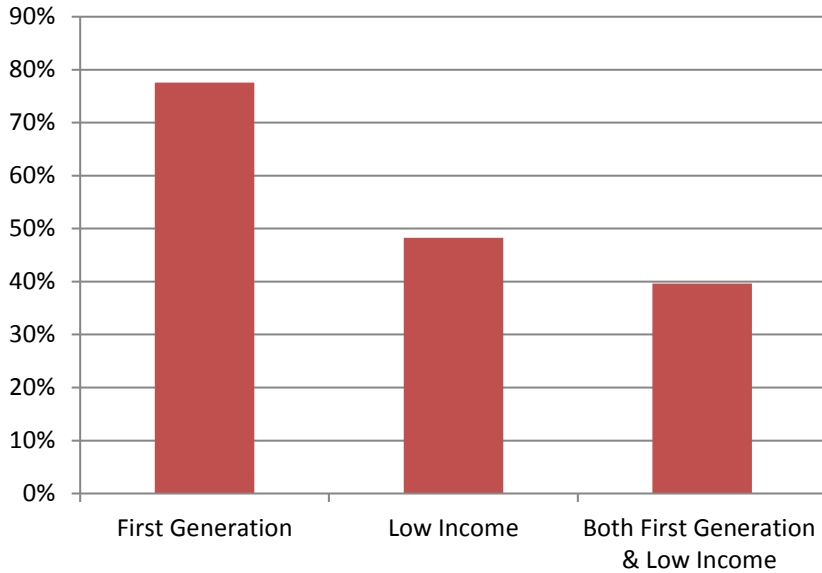

5. Provide access to information that will ensure student success in their post-secondary education endeavors.



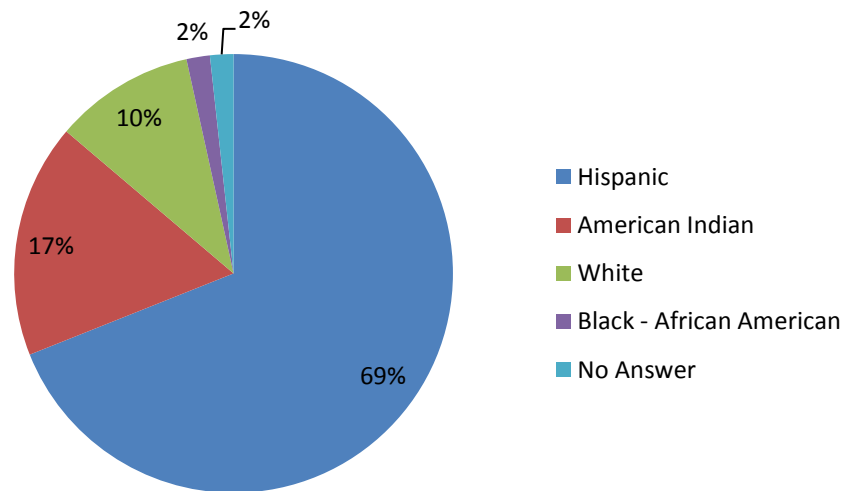
