The Division of Student Affairs is pleased to announce the appointment of Dr. Jenna Crabb as the interim Vice President for Student Affairs. Jenna has been with the University of New Mexico in various capacities since 1996. She currently serves as the Director for UNM Career Services, a position that she's held since 2006. She is a Lobo through and through as a 3-time degree recipient from UNM, earning her Bachelor of Arts degree in English and Criminology; a Master of Arts in Counseling and a Ph.D. in Counselor Education. Jenna is a Nationally Certified Counselor (NCC),

a Global Career Development Facilitator and instructor (GCDF) and a licensed Professional Mental Health Counselor for NM (LPC). She also serves as adjunct faculty/instructor for the Counselor Education program here at UNM. Her UNM career started as a student employee in Residence Life. After her undergraduate degrees, she left UNM for a short time period only to realize how much she missed the energy of campus life. She quickly returned to Residence Life as an Area Coordinator and started her professional journey within Student Affairs. She moved to Career Services after obtaining her Master's degree in Counseling in 2002.

Jenna will officially take over the helm for the Division on an interim basis on Friday, July 1 and will stay on board to help ensure a smooth transition to the new vice president, Dr. Eric Scott, whose tenure begins on August 1. Filling an interim role is not new for Jenna. She previously served as the interim director for Residence Life and Student Housing and the Dean of Students Office. "I'm looking forward to helping out our division in any way needed. I am also very excited about getting us ready for a great hand-off to our new VP, Dr. Eric Scott," Crabb says.
