

#### Dominguez Elected Chair for AERA



Dr. Nora Dominguez, director for the UNM Mentoring Institute was recently elected American Educational Research Association (AERA), chair of the Mentorship and Mentoring Practices special interest group. Her term begins at the end of this year and runs for the next three years. Founded in 1916, AERA aims to improve the educational process by encouraging scholarly inquiry related to education and evaluation and by promoting the dissemination and practical

application of research results. Dominguez joins more than 25,000 members in working on a range of settings from universities and other academic institutions to research institutes, federal and state agencies, school systems, testing companies, and nonprofit organizations. # Student Employee of the Year Nominations Open

The Student Employment Office invites you to nominate your student employee(s) for the annual Student Employee of the Year competition. Supervisors may nominate student employees whom they feel warrant particular recognition for their performance on the job. Nominations can be submitted <u>online</u> or via <u>email</u> through Friday, March 24 at 5 p.m.

Eligibility:

- Must have completed or is expected to complete at least six (6) months employment during the period of June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023
- Must have completed 6+ credit hours at UNM during Fall 2022 and enrolled for 6+ credit hours at UNM during Spring 2023
- Must be employed through the UNM Student Employment Office
- Must be in a degree seeking program for Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 semesters
- Must have at least a 2.0 GPA for Fall 2022 as well as a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

Nominations will be judged on the following characteristics: reliability, quality of work, initiative, professionalism and uniqueness of the student's contribution to the employer. Please submit your nominee's information as soon as possible. The winner will be announced on April 7, and will be recognized during Student Employment week April 10-14. Please note that additional materials <u>will not</u> be considered.
