Last week at the State of the University Address, President Stokes outlined the many outstanding accomplishments of our university in the past year as well as the innovations and growth we can expect moving into the future. Among the highlights was the enrollment growth we experienced this year which is both a reflection of and an increased demand on the important work you do to support our students and created a high-quality student experience here at UNM. Eligibility:

- Must have completed or is expected to complete at least six (6) months employment during the period of June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023
- Must have completed 6+ credit hours at UNM during Fall 2022 and enrolled for 6+ credit hours at UNM during Spring 2023
- Must be employed through the UNM Student Employment Office
- Must be in a degree seeking program for Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 semesters
- Must have at least a 2.0 GPA for Fall 2022 as well as a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

Nominations will be judged on the following characteristics: reliability, quality of work, initiative, professionalism and uniqueness of the student's contribution to the employer. Please submit your nominee's information as soon as possible. The winner will be announced on April 7, and will be recognized during Student Employment week April 10-14. Please note that additional materials <u>will not</u> be considered.
