Dear Student Affairs Colleagues,

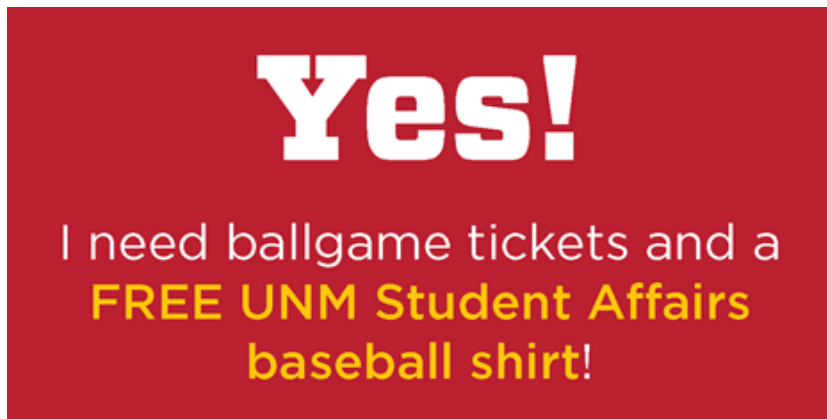

RSVP REQUIRED: Tickets and T-Shirt for Louie Awards and baseball/softball games for Student Affairs employees



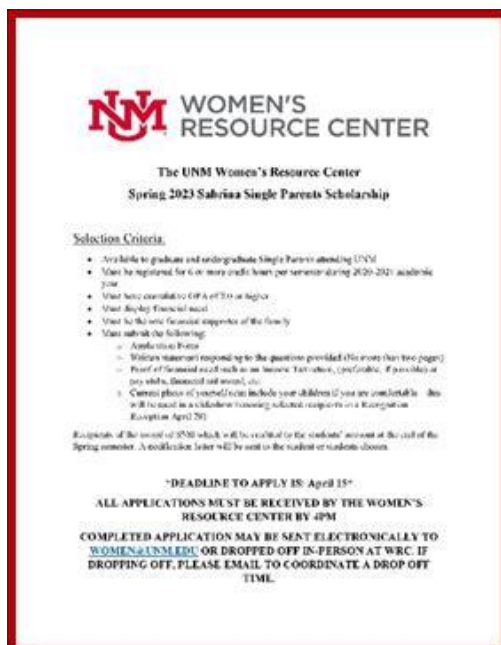

WRC Sabrina Single Parents Scholarship Spotlight



As we celebrate Women's History Month, we would like to highlight the excellent work of the Women's Resource Center dating back to 1972 when a collective of faculty, graduate students, and community members contributed to founding the UNM Women's Resource Center. Since then, the WRC continues to educate, support, and provide a safe space for women on campus through cultural and educational programming.

Scholarships for single parents are available. Many years a single mom; baby in one arm, books in the other walked on to the UNM campus. She went to the Women's Resource Center for support in returning to school. After earning two degrees she became the director of the very place that provided the support she needed when she returned to school with a baby. The [Sabrina Single Parents Scholarship](#) is for those students. Deadline to apply is April 15, 2023.

The Women's Resource Center (WRC) is a place of advocacy, support, and safety for all members of the University of New Mexico and greater community. Through a feminist model of empowerment, the WRC offers educational, social, and cultural programming aimed at encouraging women's self-determination and community engagement. women’s rights to ensure equity regardless of gender identity, sex, race, ability status, age, sexual orientation, economic class, or religious affiliation. It seeks to facilitate understanding and mutual respect among all campus and community members to achieve social justice, as well as foster a positive UNM environment. The WRC provides the tools and resources necessary to enhance success within academic, personal, and professional aspects of students’ lives.
