Dear Student Affairs Colleagues,






Kaelyn Moon

She is a 2021 Summer Bridge Academy Scholar, 2022 Association for Black Cultural Centers Undergraduate of the Year, former UNM Student government ASUNM senator, 2023 Summer Bridge Academy Counselor and Student Success Leader in African American Student Services. She currently serves as the President of the Powerful Movement of Educated Sistas and Vice President of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated - Nu Tau Chapter.

To be a productive student leader you have to be able to turn the ordinary into the extraordinary. Kaelyn Moon has shown how you can do that and more with her involvement in African American Student Services.
