

All donations will be distributed to APD and AFR and other organizations around the city to give to those experiencing traumatic situations. Three fans each won one of our grand prize baskets.

Little Lobo Holiday Wish Fund Exceeds Goal!

In December 2023, the Dean of Students Office created the Little Lobo Holiday Wish Fund(LLHWF), which provides gift cards to student parents to make the holidays a little brighter. Thanks to the generosity of supporters, the LLHWF raised \$14,120 from 65 donors, exceeding their \$10K goal. The money was used to purchase \$100 gift cards that were distributed to student parents.

Greg Golden, associate dean of student wellbeing, helped distributed the cards and said that the students were grateful and excited to receive them. "It was exciting to watch families trickle in with their children to express how grateful they were to receive the help," said Golden. "It was the best part of my holiday season!"

Student parents make up about 22% of college campus populations nationwide. Many study parents make sacrifices to support themselves and their family through the financial aid and loans they receive, along with the hours they work when not in class or with their children.

The University of New Mexico supports its student parents via various services including childcare at the UNM Children's Campus; and lactation stations, family-friendly computer pods, student-led workshops, SNAP application assistance and free counseling and confidential advisory through the Women's Resource Center.

Donations raised this past year will help to kickstart the fund for 2024's holiday season. The Dean of Students Office, UNM Children's Campus, and Student Affairs are eager to do it again this year.

El Mezquite Scholarship

selection committee will base scholarships on educational achievement, leadership qualities, a written essay, and a strong need for financial assistance. Scholarship awards of \$1,000 will be awarded for the spring semester.

AASS Black History Month Student Spotlight

As African American Student Services continues their <u>Black History Month celebration</u>, the CONNECT will be spotlighting some of our Black student leaders throughout February who have been recognized for their service by both AASS and Africana Studies this year. This week, we feature Nakia Jackson.

Nakia is a senior majoring in Africana Studies and Signed Language Interpreting at the University of New Mexico. She is a 2020 African American Student Services Summer Bridge Academy Scholar, a 2022 African American Student Services Award recipient and has served in various executive roles including UNM's student government ASUNM, the Black Student Union, the NM Black Student Alliance Youth Council, the Multicultural Greek Council and the Tau Phi chapter Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated.

The leadership of Nakia Jackson has been exhibited in both virtual and physical spaces. She was a member of the virtual cohort of the African American Student Services Summer Bridge Academy during the COVID-19 pandemic. Upon completion of the Summer Bridge Academy Nakia became a mentee for the Black Over Student Success (B.O.S.S.) Program where she took advantage of various opportunities to grow as a student leader. She then dove into the executive leadership roles within the Black Student Union where she assisted in holding space for Black students to connect during the pandemic and supported the organization's transition back to in person operations. Her dedication to both building community and achieving academic excellence while at UNM have set an example of what it means to be a dynamic student leader at the University of New Mexico.



Lena Clauve Outstanding Senior Award
