BOUNDLESS OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship is available to non-traditional students in Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming who are enrolled at select two- and four-year colleges and universities. These schools then award need-based scholarships to their students using funds provided by the Daniels Fund.

The Boundless Opportunity Scholarship is open to applicants from these often overlooked student populations:

- Adults entering or returning to college
- GED recipients
- Veterans entering or returning to college
- Former foster care youth
- Former juvenile justice youth
- ROTC participants

To be eligible, an applicant must be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States, as well as a legal resident of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming.

The University of New Mexico announced today that it has received a \$45,000 grant from the Daniels Fund to provide Boundless Opportunity Scholarships to non-traditional students. The Boundless Opportunity Scholarship (BOS) is designed to benefit motivated nontraditional students who recognize the power of education to create a better life for themselves and their families.

"We're excited to be named a recipient of this award because 100% of these funds go directly to students who often experience financial hardships and barriers while pursuing higher education. Reducing the out-of-pocket costs for our students has a ripple effect, by allowing money that would normally go directly to tuition and fees to be allocated towards some of their other needs," says Jose Villar, Director, College Enrichment & Outreach Programs.

These need-based scholarships are available to specific student populations including adults entering or returning to college, GED recipients, veterans entering or returning to college, former foster care youth, and ROTC participants.
